Courage must run in the family!

Miriam, the sister of Moses & Aaron and the only daughter of Amram & Jochebed makes her entrance into scripture near the water, which seems to be consistent in her life. History tells us that she is about 10 or 11 when Pharaoh declares that all male Israelite babies be drowned and killed. Fearful (for good reason!) Jochebed places Moses into a basket and places him into the river. She then sends Miriam, the older sister, to look after the basket. I wonder if Miriam had to fight off alligators, or other animals that may consider the young baby for a meal. There's no doubt she was praying, asking God to spare the life of her little brother. And, because God is good like that, He doesn't just save Moses, He places him in the house of Pharaoh. Think about that for a moment, what looked like SURE defeat, sudden death, was actually setting the stage for a blessing.

Has that ever happened to you? A real-life Romans 8:28 ordeal? Not today Satan, our God is in control!

And while this study isn't about Moses I believe it is important to point out that all the time spent in the palace (40 years to be exact) allowed him to know how to communicate with Pharaoh & his royal staff when it was time for Moses to approach Pharaoh and plea to let God's people go from slavery and bondage.

When the enemy thought he would kill one of God's chosen, God turned around and used him to free an entire nation! Remember, this man Moses, was the brother of Miriam. I don't doubt that she had a supercharged faith. Watching her brother walk out the will of God, seeing signs and wonders, seeing the plagues play out before her eyes... It's hard to think that someone with that kind of access to seeing God's goodness would struggle with pride, jealousy or gossip. But isn't that just like us? We watch God heal our bodies, save our children, give us favor -- yet we still fall victim to sin. We still allow the shouts of the enemy to override what we know should be compassion and acceptance.

Miriam was the first to sing the praises of God after the Red Sea Miracle! Could you imagine leading that choir?! Oh what singing, Oh what shouting! The song outlined in Exodus still rings in my ear every time I remind the devil that he's under my feet.

What is your "red sea miracle"? Where / how have you seen God move in amazement?

Her brother, Aaron, the high priest called her a "prophetess"! In fact, she is the first prophetess that we see in the scripture. She was basically the worship leader who could prophesy! Talk about a mighty woman.

But did you notice the communicated tone in Miriam's voice as she talks to Aaron about Moses' new wife? She traded in her joyous praise for a note of total disapproval. And did you see the reaction of God? He was NOT happy. Scripture tells us that he heard of Miriam's chit-chat and slapped her with leprosy. [gasp] Talk about feeling like an outsider. You think being diagnosed with COVID19 makes you the black sheep, try being Moses' sister and coming down with a disease that requires you to sit OUTSIDE of the camp. *Without social media.* Talk about feeling disconnected! But let's just be frank here, we reap what we sow. And can we just take a moment and praise God for Jesus & the new covenant!? Now I'm not saying that we are exempt from reaping, but we are under a new covenant and when we repent from sin God is faithful & just to forgive us.

The Bible doesn't come out and tell us why Miriam decided to be a total Mean Girl in regards to Moses' new wife. But since she's never mentioned in scripture after this, I'd dare say it's deeper than waking up on the wrong side of the tent. I believe Miriam had some deep seeded jealousy, as she was unmarried. And likely some pride that led her to believe women from other locations were less-than.

While I prayed about Miriam for months, I felt that she still had more to do. That there was still some untapped potential. But it was cut short.

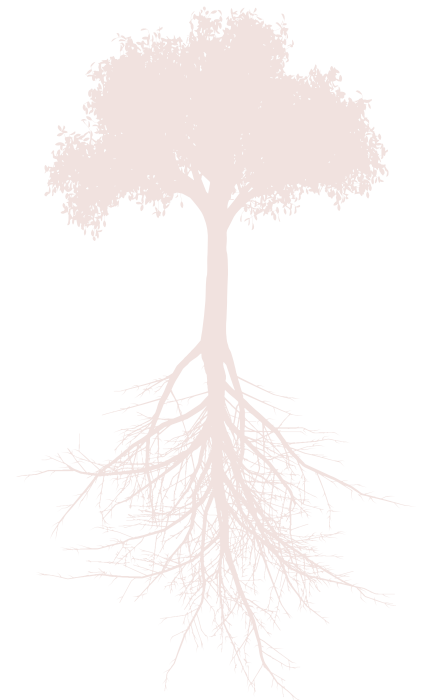
Why?

In your prayer time this week ask the Lord to reveal to you any seeds of jealousy, bitterness, or racism. While Miriam had much to offer, its likely that her time being a mouthpiece for God was cut short due to seeds, that took root. Let's spend some time allowing God to reveal these things to us, repent and ask for the Lord to shape our hearts and minds in a way that pleases heaven.

Enter Satan stage left.

I have often wondered why the Lord allowed Satan into the garden, and if we are honest we wonder why the Lord has allowed pain, heartache, loss and turmoil in our lives as well. However I think it is clear that God wants a people who will love Him because they want to. A people who will obey Him because they want to. And if we want to get real technical we can peek at the verbiage that Jesus uses in the Lords prayer, saying that we should ask the Father to lead us NOT into temptation. Meaning that there are times where we are led into temptation. Why? For the trying of our faith produces patience, and our trials turn into testimonies. And how do we overcome? By the blood of our lamb, and the word of our testimony. No trial? No temptation? No testimony.

When Satan slithers into the scene in Chapter 3 we see that right from the beginning he is trying to start conversation with Eve. Do you notice the tone of the enemy? He is fishing for information. Satan is NOT all knowing like The Father, so he is asking Eve for information. Rather than rebuking Him from the get go, she entertains his question. When she replies she tells the enemy what it was that God said. Right away the enemy begins to discredit the words that God has spoken. "You shall not surely die..." he says to Eve. Then he continues on with with his lies.

How often does this happen within us? God speaks in our prayer time, The Holy Spirit whispers, someone prophesies over you and the minute we leave that sweet spot, the enemy starts in with his lies.

*God surely didn't mean that.*

*There's no way you can amount to that.*

*You're too old / You're too young.*

*It's always been this way, it's not going to change.*

*God will use someone else, he can't use someone like you to do something like that.*

Sound familiar?

Eve gave place to the enemy. And when we give him an inch, he takes a mile. Then Eve looked on the fruit, the sin, and saw that it looked good. And she impulsively ate it. She did not consult her husband, she didn't pray about it - she indulged. Notice here what Satan ALWAYS appeals to. Its either the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes or the pride of life, or a combination. He has no new tricks, my friend.

And look the influence that Eve had on her husband.

And her children, Cain and Abel - one of them turned into a murder. Do you see how sin multiplies? Do you see how greatly our decisions effect MUCH more than just us?

Remember how before all of this they knew no sin and they knew no shame? Now that they've eaten of the tree they immediately hide from God.

See that?

Sin seperates us from God.

When the Lord confronts them and they tell him why they are hiding he says "Who told you...."

And that is what I want to ask you today.

Who told you you couldn't accomplish that dream?

Who told you that you werent pretty enough?

Who told you that you weren't called?

We must get to a place where we refuse to give place the the enemy. We must be so confident in the words that God has spoken to us that we refuse to be talked out of them. And we must always remember that there is so much more at stake than what meets the eye.

Rebuke It.

This week I want you to be intentional regarding your thought life. Each day ask the Lord to guard your thought life, and to help you be aware of the enemies attack on your mind. Anytime the enemy tries to bring a lie to your mind, openly (out loud) rebuke the devil Do not fall for his traps like Eve did. Refuse to give him any place in your mind.



Write it Out.

Seek Him.

You're not getting out of your prayer closet so soon! This week let's get cozy in our prayer closet. Make time twice this week where you can shut out the world and seek the face of God. Crank up the worship music and ask God to reveal to you lies that you have given place to. Make sure you have your journal handy and expect Him to speak. As he reveals these lies and you write them out, try to find a scripture that validates its opposite. For example if the Lord tells you that you've given place to the lie that you will never get out of debt write the scripture in Deut. 28:12-14

Noah, in my eyes, is simply remarkable. In short he stood on Gods word, that was spoken to him regarding building the arc to save a portion of humanity. Think about it, Noah didn't even have a bible to reference, he had a personal relationship with God that allowed God to speak to him. (See the importance of a Prayer Closet?) Noah took that conversation and *literally* built from it.

How often do we get a word from the Lord and discount it? Or doubt it? Or we pull the classic "if you are speaking to me Lord, please confirm it! Give me a sign!" Don't worry, I do it much more than I'd like to admit.

Now while it's possible the Bible leaves out some doubt or prayers back and forth between Noah and God, he still relentlessly believed in what God told him and he began building. Often times the Lord can be rather vague with His directions, but in this case He was very specific on how he wanted Noah to build the arc. Can you imagine the criticism Noah must have recieved from his peers and those surrounding him? They must have thought Noah was simply off his rocker. Remember y'all, it had never rained from the sky before. And not only was Noah calling for rain, he was calling for a FLOOD.

*Has God ever given you an assignment like this? Something so far out in left field you doubt His direction? Find comfort in the story of Noah, and remember that God uses ordinary humans to carry out his extraordinary blessings.*

Noah's efforts paired with his trust in God saved an entire race, the human race. Noah's story is proof that it's not just about us. Noah was persistent. He didn't just build this arc in a week, it took him 120 years. Some of us would give up on a promise from God in 72 hours if it didn't manifest. There is a lot we can learn here from this mighty man of faith.

Again we can see your calling isn't just about you. It's about every one it's supposed to reach. **It's about generations being impacted for the gospel all because you said yes.**

And what if, each day you wait to step into what God's calling you to, you delay the blessing for someone else?  
*ouch.*

Unfortunately Noah wasn't a bed of roses all the time. In fact after the arc landed on dry ground Noah planted a vineyard, got drunk and basically passed out naked.

We know from several verses in the scriptures that God doesn't like drunkenness. Yet, Noah lived another three hundred plus years after the flood.



However I find it interesting that this is the last mention of any accomplishments of Noah. It's possible that he just kicked back to enjoy his life post-flood, however I think we should also consider that this last recorded act of disobedience cut Noah's work short prematurely. Let's learn from this and strive to never go against God's word, we have too much at stake!

I heard a well respected preacher say that Prayer produces Holiness, and revival always starts with Holiness. Therefore we can gather that **in order to truly see revival in this nation we must seek the Lord in purposeful prayer.** The kind of prayer that leads to pruning. The kind of conversations with the Creator of the universe that produces a longing for more of His spirit. Which in turn will draw us to refinement, and pull us further from this world and the counterfeit peace that the enemy offers. I have found in my life that before God calls me higher, He often takes me low

Low to a place of humbleness. A place of consecration. There is a new level of prayer that I step into, a new level of studying His word. There is always more that is required of me spiritually when God is calling me higher..

Sounds familiar doesn't it? To much that is given, much is required.

It would be easy to simply get fat off the blessings of God. But if we truly want to be impactful in our generation, if we truly want God to use us - we must come out from among the world and be separate. We must give our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to the Lord. We must seek righteousness, and run from anything that appears to be sin. And I'm not just talking about the heavy hitters like adultery, but I'm saying that it's been my experience that God will cause you to have a change of taste for the things you used to love, and it will pull you closer to Him.

For example, I used to totally love 90's music. But as I walk into deeper waters with the Lord, as I ask him to mold my heart into His, I find that when I switch that on in the car, I become unformatable with the lyrics. I am reminded that Satan used to be the worship leader in heaven and he'd love nothing more than to pervert the very sounds that were created to give him glory. And before I know it I am singing along to Praise & worship music. Now, this isn't a lesson on music - but it is a reminder to seek holiness. And a prompting for you to ask the Lord what area in your life needs pruning.

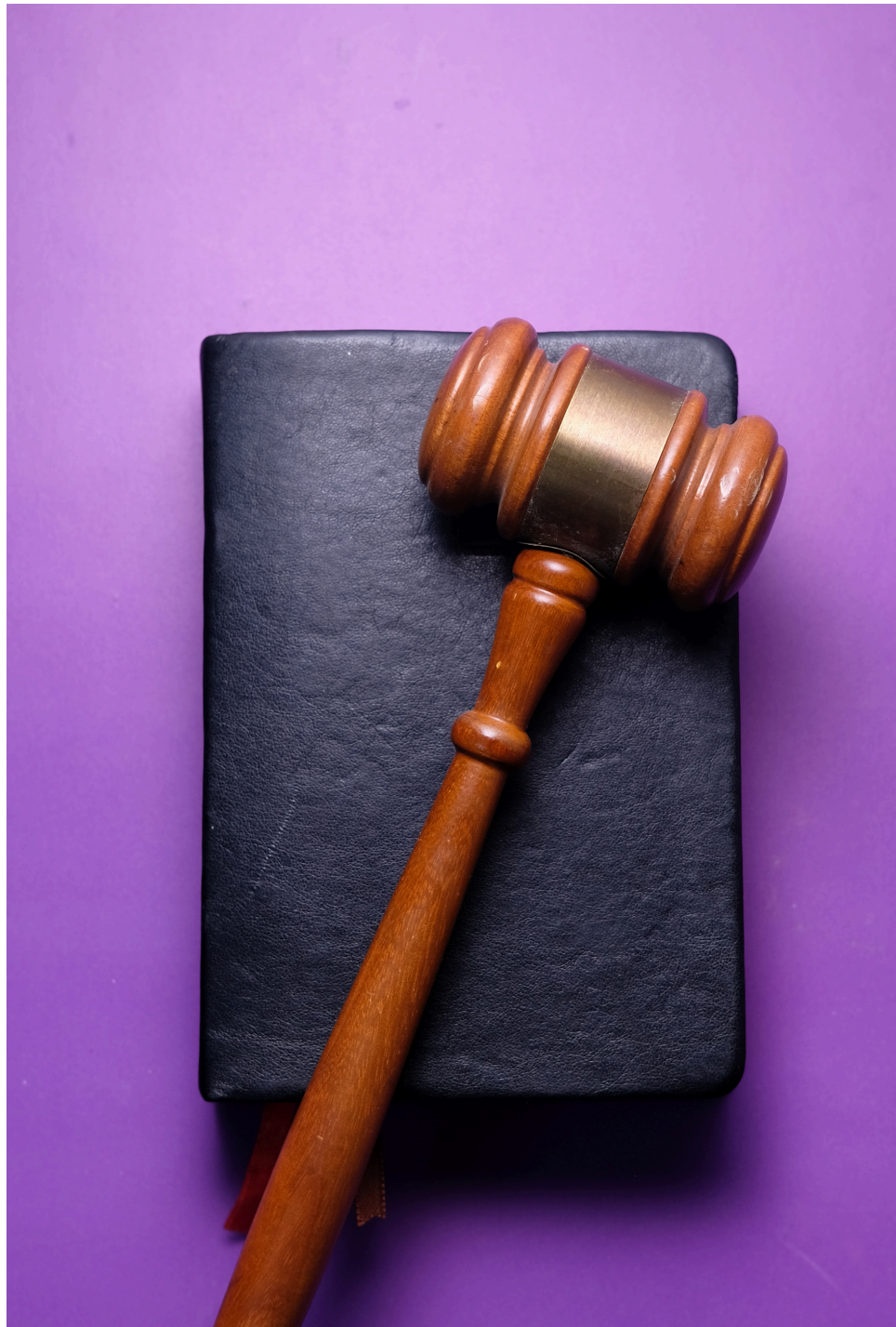

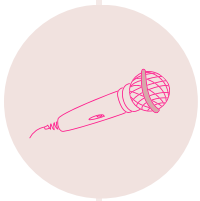

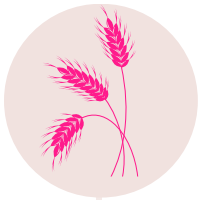

# The Double E's

Can we take a moment and appreciate the humor of Elijah? When I read through 1 Kings 18 I can't help but giggle. In verse 27 Elijah starts to poke fun at the prophet's of Baal, "Maybe you need to shout louder" "Maybe he is sleeping or daydreaming"! I love the confidence we see here of Elijah. It makes me wonder how our life might look different if we took the same attitude when people, or even the enemy comes to us to cause us to doubt. Later in 1 Kings 18 we read of Elijah calling literal fire down from heaven. What a mighty man of God! I love that he was not swayed when the enemy tried to come and "one up him". When they tried to call down fire themselves, but clearly couldn't conjure up anything, even after cutting themselves and crying out to their evil Gods. Look closely at the prayer of Elijah in verse 36-37. In the NLT he says "...answer me so these people will know that you O Lord are God..." Look at the heart. Elijah seeks to lift up God, to draw men to him. Oh, that our hearts would echo this prayer! Lord do mighty acts through us so that the world, so that the enemy's own can see and know that YOU are God! Shortly after this mighty act we see the threat of Jezebel cause him to literally retreat to hiding and ask God to take his life. It would be easy to look at this and scoff, but the spirit of Jezebel is nothing to mess with. There are many teachings in the body of Christ on this specific spirit and how to stay strong when under attack. Let's continue to look at the rhetoric of Elijah as he talks to God. While he lays complaining under a broom tree the Lord (seeming totally frustrated) says (in my version) Elijah suck it up, you are not the only person sold out, I have 7,000 other people who haven't even bowed a knee to the enemy.

Isn't this just like us today?

The enemy gets us to think we are the ONLY ones believing for a miracle, the ONLY ones sold out to Christ, the ONLY ones who really believe in the Holy Ghost, the ONLY ones struggling with the responsibilities of being a wife / student / mother / etc.

When in reality we are surrounded by people walking the same walk as us! And probably looking for companionship, asking themselves the same questions!

The enemy may be sneaky, but he always shows his cards. There is nothing new under the sun.

Now look at our gracious heavenly father, who provides someone to help carry the load, someone to carry on in ministry, someone to take the mantle, Elisha.

The word tells us that Elisha studied under Elijah and followed him. I think this mirrors for us the need for not only Godly friendship, but mentors in the body of Christ. To me this is why the older generation is SO needed in the church house. We need their wisdom, and they need the determination and zeal that the younger generation possess. While the roles can always be flip-flopped we can see that it's vital to surround yourself with people you can glean from.

I love that Elisha is plowing the field when he "gets his big break". This is symbolic of working in the ministry. It would be so easy to sit around and say "I know God has a call on my life, so I am going to sit around and wait on God to tell Joyce Meyer my phone number so that I can join her on tour!" But this isn't how it works in the kingdom. To be over much, we must be faithful with little. God looks at our heart, and until he can develop a heart of service in us, he will never use us for miracles, signs and wonders.

I have said before that when we are seeking our next promotion, we must faithfully serve where we are at, and we can see that ring true here in this story of Elijah and Elisha.

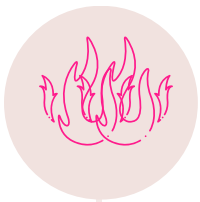
And what about Elijah's grand exit from this Earth?! A chariot of fire!

The Holy Ghost, the power, the Essence, the spirit of God (which dwells in believers with a clean vessel) enables us to do the same.

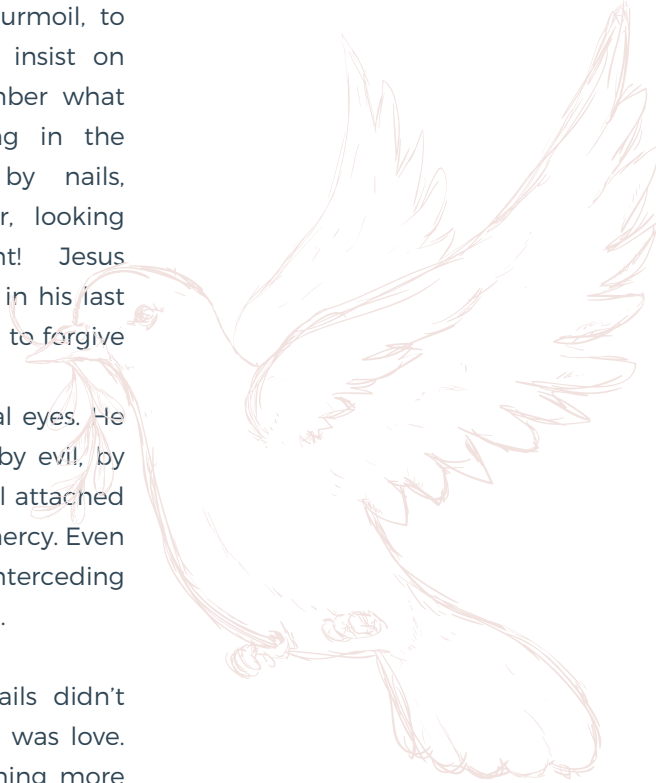

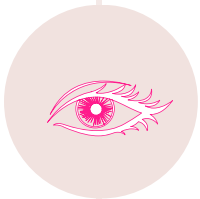
